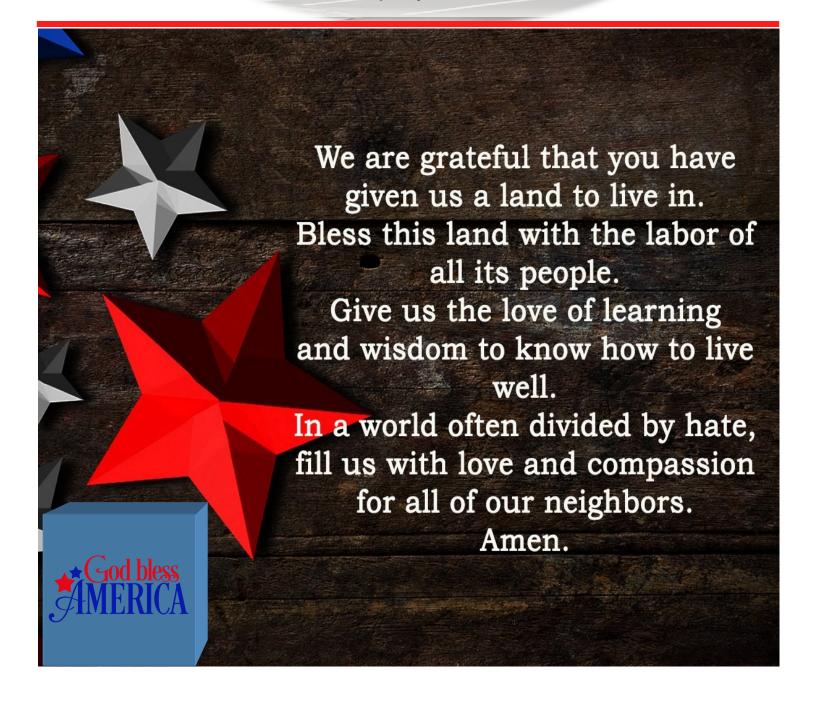

The Association for the Study of African American Life and History is an organization dedicated to the study and appreciation of African-American History founded by Carter G Woodson on September 9, 1915.





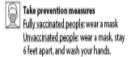

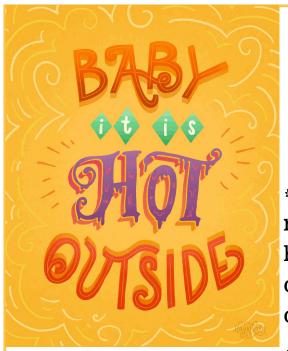

How to keep cool during a heat wave

Stay in air-conditioned buildings as much as possible. If your home doesn't have air conditioning, contact your local health department or locate an airconditioned shelter in your area.

Do not rely on a fan as your main cooling source when it's extremely hot.

- Drink more water than usual and don't wait until you're thirsty to drink. If your doctor limits the amount of fluids you drink or has you on water pills, ask how much you should drink during hot weather.
- Avoid using the stove or oven to cook it will make you and your house hotter.
- Wear loose, lightweight, light-colored clothing.
- Take cool showers or baths.
- Skip strenuous activities and get plenty of rest.
- Check on a friend or neighbor and have someone do the same for you.
